FEMA:

HPUD Operations:

HPUD is working on some minor improvements to the Wastewater Lab to increase safety and efficiency. Staff will continue with the sewer cleaning project moving on to the alleys of Valley Blvd and Grand Ave. We budgeted for replacement of our chlorine chiller in FY 2023/2024 [WT-08 \$17,542], however the item was backordered and it still unavailable. The compressor on chiller has been replaced, breaker now needs replacement. Chlorine tank (2,000 gl) has cracked and need replacement. Wifi at Water Plant has been upgraded to ensure no alarms are missed. Motor on 6th street lift station has been replaced.
